

## The Launch of the "16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence" Campaign

Under the distinguished patronage of H.E. Wafaa Bani Mustafa, Minister of State for Legal Affairs, the global "16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence" campaign was inaugurated. This year's theme, "Together to end violence against women in the public and political spheres."

H.E. Bani Mustafa voiced the Government's dedication to countering gender-based violence, understanding its intrinsic role in fostering sustainable development and nurturing a society where everyone has an equitable say in decision-making.

This year's campaign theme was inspired by a comprehensive study by the Jordanian National Commission for Women, focusing on political violence against women.

Moreover, UN Women has been running a series of activities in its OASIS centers as part of the campaign, funded by the EU Trust Fund 'Madad'. These activities reinforce the message of the 16 Days Campaign, highlighting the need to protect and empower women at every level.
