






Sample distribution

Violence against women

Psychological, sexual, and verbal abuse are all considered different forms of violence against women.



Violence against women can occur in the streets, schools, workplaces and refugee camps.



A woman should tolerate violence in order to keep her family together.



It is acceptable to punish a daughter/sister/wife who has shamed her family.



Women prefer to report cases of violence to female officers rather than male officers.



Women and men have equal roles to play in preventing violence against women (VAW).




Women should play an active role in preventing gender-based violence in their communities.

Key findings



Women should be more accommodating and caring than men.



A woman's role is to stay at home and take care of her family.



Men and boys should spend more time on house-chores (cooking, cleaning ... etc.)



Women and girls should get the approval of men before making any important decisions.



A man's most important role in his house is to take care of finances and do home repairs.



80% 70% I do not mind having a female boss at work.

33% 40% When women work, they are taking jobs away from men.

35% 50% Men should be given preference over women in being hired or promoted.

81% 83% Women are pressured to choose between being a good wife/mother or having a career.



85% 78% Where gender equality is supported, societies are more peaceful.

52% 72% The leadership of communities should largely be in the hands of men.

88% 74% Increasing women's participation in peacekeeping has a positive impact on preventing conflict and achieving sustainable peace.

68% 63% Women are perceived as leaders and agents of peace in their families and communities.

89% 69% Women should be given the same opportunities as men to improve their communities, while working towards sustainable peace.

46% 54% Enough progress has been achieved in Jordan on gender equality.



Women will neglect household chores if they reach decision making positions.



Women elected in decision-making positions are usurping men's rightful place.



Women in leadership positions lack the ability to solve problems.
